While some of the information which is contained in this series is now dated -- being as I did write it just under twenty-seven years ago -- nevertheless, I have decided to proofread and update it, and keep it on the Bill's Bible Basics website due to its historical importance. Also, I have added a lot of new information to the series as well so that it aligns with current events as of the end of the year 2025. The fact is that many modern people are not even aware of how long the conflict between the Israelis and the Palestinians has been going on. Neither are they aware of the different peace plans which have been proposed over the

decades, all of which have failed to result in permanent peace between these two peoples.

As I explain in a few other articles, while Lebanon, Jordan and Egypt have sided with Syria in past conflicts against the state of Israel, as some of my readers will know, since that time, each of these countries has negotiated various peace initiatives -- if not full-fledged peace agreements, with Israel. The first of these nations to do this was of course Egypt. Forty-seven years ago in September of 1978, Egyptian President, Muhammad Anwar al-Sadat, and Israeli Prime Minister, Menachem Begin, signed the historic Camp David Accords, in the presence of American President, Jimmy Carter. As a result of his peace overtures with the state of Israel, Anwar Sadat was assassinated not too long after that by Islamic extremists.

While some of you are familiar with the fact that the Camp David Accords dealt with the future of the Sinai Peninsula, and peace arrangements between Israel and Egypt, what fewer people realize, is that the reason they are referred to in the plural -- that is to say, as the Accords -- is because the document signed by Anwar Sadat and Begin was actually a two-part agreement. Peace between Egypt and Israel was only half of the objectives which had been agreed upon in said document.

The second half of the Accords established a format for the conduct of negotiations for the establishment of an autonomy regime in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. In other words, the purpose of the Camp David Accords was not just for the establishment of a lasting peace between Egypt and Israel. They were also meant to begin the process which would in the long run result in the establishment of an autonomous -- or self-governing -- homeland for the displaced Palestinians. That is to say, a Palestinian State. My friends, that was over forty-seven years ago!

Tragically, while the Camp David Accords did indeed lead to a lasting peace between Egypt and Israel, the second half of the agreements, which dealt with the future of the West Bank -- that is to say, Judea and Samaria -- and the Gaza Strip, was later interpreted differently by Israel, Egypt, and the United States. Personally, upon reading the contents of the Accords, I can only conclude that their intent is actually quite clear. If any ambiguity has resulted from the Accords, I can only conclude that it is simply another byproduct of

Jewish minds, who have no interest or desire whatsoever, in providing a legitimate home for the displaced Palestinians.

As later became clear with the 1998 Wye Memorandum -- which I'll be discussing later on in this same series -- and as I have been saying for a long time, the Jews are masters when it comes to the spoken and the written word. They are expert manipulators who know how to twist and pervert what has been said or written. Those people possess a very keen ability to talk and negotiate for literally years -- decades in fact -- while never really giving up a single thing. That is simply how good they are at what they do.

Furthermore, as some of my readers will know, in some of the latest news reports as we approach the end of 2025, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has completely pulled off the Band-Aid, and plainly stated that as long as he remains in power, the Palestinians will NEVER be given their own state. In short, it has been a long con all along which has lasted for literally decades now. That is the way of those Jews.

Now if you happen to be Jewish, or a pro-Israel Christian who finds my words a bit offensive, or if you doubt that what I'm saying is true, then in all fairness, allow me to present to you a few actual excerpts which are taken from the Camp David Accords of 1978. To reiterate, the various points which are outlined below were in fact agreed upon by both Israel and Egypt, over forty-seven years ago. Perhaps after reading the following material, you will better understand why a certain percentage of the Palestinians deemed it necessary to resort to less than honorable measures -- meaning extreme violence -- in order to achieve their long-sought-for objectives.

Please understand that by my saying this, I am most certainly NOT siding with the Palestinians, or condoning in any way the Palestinian's violence. Perhaps you will also begin to better understand why then Palestinian National Authority president -- Yasser Arafat -- eventually set a deadline of May 4, 1999, as the date when, regardless of what had occurred politically up until that point in time, he would unilaterally declare the establishment of a Palestinian State, with East Jerusalem as its capital. Of course, as we all know now, that boast turned out to be another pipe dream which really never came to fruition. Here then are the aforementioned excerpts from the actual Camp David Accords which pertain to the eventual establishment of a Palestinian state:

----- Begin Quote -----

"Egypt and Israel agree that, in order to ensure a peaceful and orderly transfer of authority, and taking into account the security concerns of all the parties, there should be transitional arrangements for the West Bank and Gaza for a period not exceeding five years. In order to provide full autonomy to the inhabitants, under these arrangements the Israeli military government and its civilian administration will be withdrawn as soon as a self-governing authority has been freely elected by the inhabitants of these areas to replace the existing military government."

"When the self-governing authority (administrative council) in the West Bank and Gaza is established and inaugurated, the transitional period of five years will begin. As soon as possible, but not later than the third year after the beginning of the transitional period, negotiations will take place to determine the final status of the West Bank and Gaza and its relationship with its neighbors and to conclude a peace treaty between Israel and Jordan by the end of the transitional period. These negotiations will be conducted among Egypt, Israel, Jordan and the elected representatives of the inhabitants of the West Bank and Gaza."

----- End Quote -----

While Egypt has had peace for decades now, as I already said, the Palestinians have remained without a legitimate homeland of their own for the very same length of time. In fact, it's been longer than that, because they really became displaced the minute that Israel was declared a nation in May of 1948, in order to accommodate the Jews. The point is, the Palestinians are more than tired of all Of the Jewish rhetoric and the long con, and they now want to see empty Jewish talk translated into real progress on the ground. Tragically, as is well known, the only facts on the ground they have actually experienced is the West Bank being sliced and diced up even more by the Israelis, as well as the extremely brutal war in the Gaza Strip. This war has now

taken the lives of many thousands of Gazan non-combatants, and left the Gaza Strip in ruins. I discuss this topic in more detail in other articles such as "Donald Trump, Gaza, and the Tyre Prophecy" and "Gaza Strip Horrors and the Trump Plan". To be clear, I am fully aware of the fact that Israel used Hamas' slaughter of approximately 1,200 Israeli citizens as a justification for its most recent incursion into the Gaza Strip. Of course, in all fairness, I should mention here that according to certain online sources, there is some degree of ambiguity regarding why Israel did not detect what was about to unfold on that fateful day, as well as regarding exactly how October 7th unfolded in the first place. Was there really failure on the Israeli side, or did they purposely allow the Hamas slaughter to occur? Regardless, as I point out in the aforementioned articles, what Hamas did was wicked, evil and indefensible. Surely they knew how Israel would choose to retaliate, so they share the blame with regard to what has happened in the Gaza Strip since that time over two years ago.

Continuing our discussion concerning the Camp David Accords, as you can see by the previous excerpts, what was initially envisioned as being a maximum of a five-year process, has now stretched out to almost fifty years. The reasons for this are many, and it is only fair to say that all parties concerned are to blame in one way or another. This, of course, includes the Palestinian suicide bombers -- which I discuss in another article entitled "Palestinian Suicide Bombers and Middle East Peace" -- the various intifadas, etc. As far as this writer is concerned, neither side really remains innocent. There is treachery and subterfuge on both sides of the fence.

Now, if you do happen to side with a particular party in this sordid affair, then I can only conclude that unbeknownst to you, you have simply been brainwashed and obviously deceived by the Jewish-controlled mainstream media. If such happens to be the case, I also encourage you to read my article entitled "Gaslighting: We Are Being Manipulated and Surveilled".

What I find sad, is that the language which was incorporated into the Camp David Accords, has been included and expanded upon in various other Middle East peace documents since that time. Despite this fact, as I already said, the Palestinians are still without a homeland of their own as 2025 comes to an

end. It is based upon the terms and conditions which were set forth in two of the documents -- which were signed and agreed upon by the Israeli government and the Palestinian Liberation Organization -- that PLO President Yasser Arafat derived his legal authority to unilaterally declare the creation of the Palestinian State in May of 1999.

Upon reading said documents, it appears that Arafat had every legal right to do so, because the Israeli leadership did in fact clearly renege on the terms upon which it had agreed. Of course, the Israelis threw the very same accusation at the Palestinians. In fact, it is common knowledge that whenever two parties go to war, when they eventually decide that it is time to negotiate for peace, the incriminations begin sooner or later. In other words, they accuse each other of breaking the terms of their peace agreement. We hear news of the very same thing occurring between the Russians and the Ukrainians, and between the Israelis and the Palestinians in Gaza right now. So there is nothing new under the Sun, as King Solomon wrote in the following Bible verses:

"The thing that hath been, it is that which shall be; and that which is done is that which shall be done: and there is no new thing under the sun. Is there any thing whereof it may be said, See, this is new? it hath been already of old time, which was before us."

Ecclesiastes 1:9-10, KJV

At any rate, the first of these two documents was called the Declaration Of Principles, which is also known as the Oslo I Accord. Signed in Washington, DC on the 13th of September in 1993 by Shimon Perez for the government of Israel, as well as by Mahmoud Abbas -- also known as Abu Mazen -- who headed the Palestinian Liberation Organization, this legal and binding document contained some of the very same language which had been included in its predecessor -- that is to say, in the Camp David Accords -- which was signed fifteen years earlier. Following are some selected clauses I have extracted from the Declaration Of Principles to verify this point:

----- Begin Quote -----

Article I

AIM OF THE NEGOTIATIONS

The aim of the Israeli-Palestinian negotiations within the

current Middle East peace process is, among other things, to establish a Palestinian Interim Self-Government Authority, the elected Council (the "Council"), for the Palestinian people in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip, for a transitional period not exceeding five years, leading to a permanent settlement based on Security Council Resolution 242 and 338.

...

Article V

TRANSITIONAL PERIOD AND PERMANENT STATUS NEGOTIATIONS

1. The five-year transitional period will begin upon the withdrawal from the Gaza Strip and Jericho area.
2. Permanent status negotiations will commence as soon as possible, but not later than the beginning of the third year of the interim period, between the Government of Israel and the Palestinian people representatives.
3. It is understood that these negotiations shall cover remaining issues, including: Jerusalem, refugees, settlements, security arrangements, borders, relations and cooperation with other neighbors, and other issues of common interest.

...

Article XIII

REDEPLOYMENT OF ISRAELI FORCES

1. After the entry into force of this Declaration of Principles, and not later than the eve of elections for the Council, a redeployment of Israeli military forces in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip will take place, in addition to withdrawal of Israeli forces carried out in accordance with Article XIV.
2. In redeploying its military forces, Israel will be guided by the principle that its military forces should be redeployed outside populated areas.
3. Further redeployments to specified locations will be gradually implemented commensurate with the assumption of

responsibility for public order and internal security by the Palestinian police force pursuant to Article VIII above.

Article XIV

ISRAELI WITHDRAWAL FROM THE GAZA STRIP AND JERICHO AREA

Israel will withdraw from the Gaza Strip and Jericho area, as detailed in the protocol attached as Annex II.

...

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

1. This Declaration of Principles will enter into force one month after its signing.

...

Annex II

PROTOCOL ON WITHDRAWAL OF ISRAELI FORCES FROM THE GAZA STRIP AND JERICHO AREA

1. The two sides will conclude and sign within two months from the date of entry into force of this Declaration of Principles, an agreement on the withdrawal of Israeli military forces from the Gaza Strip and Jericho area. This agreement will include comprehensive arrangements to apply in the Gaza Strip and the Jericho area subsequent to the Israeli withdrawal.

2. Israel will implement an accelerated and scheduled withdrawal of Israeli military forces from the Gaza Strip and Jericho area, beginning immediately with the signing of the agreement on the Gaza Strip and Jericho area and to be completed within a period not exceeding four months after the signing of this agreement.

...

g. Arrangements for a safe passage for persons and transportation between Gaza Strip and Jericho area.

4. The above agreement will include arrangements for coordination between both parties regarding passages:

a. Gaza--Egypt; and

b. Jericho--Jordan

----- End Quote -----

Based upon the contents of the Declaration Of Principles, the following year, on May 4, 1994, Palestinian President, Yasser Arafat, signed another interim document with then Israeli Prime Minister, Yitzhak Rabin. This agreement is known as the Gaza-Jericho Autonomy Agreement, and is also referred to as the Cairo Agreement, being as it was signed in Cairo, Egypt. The signing of this document was witnessed by representatives of the governments of the United States of America, the Russian Federation, and the Arab Republic of Egypt.

Please notice that the Jericho area in eastern Israel is an important element contained in this particular agreement. As a matter of historical interest, and as some of my more Bible knowledgeable readers will already know, Jericho was one of the very first cities which was conquered by Joshua and the Israelites, after they had crossed the Jordan River, coming in from what is now known as Jordan, and then as Moab. You may recall the story of the harlot, Rahab, who protected the Israelite spies by hiding them under her roof. Consider the following group of Bible verses:

"And Joshua the son of Nun sent out of Shittim two men to spy secretly, saying, Go view the land, even Jericho. And they went, and came into an harlot's house, named Rahab, and lodged there. And it was told the king of Jericho, saying, Behold, there came men in hither to night of the children of Israel to search out the country. And the king of Jericho sent unto Rahab, saying, Bring forth the men that are come to thee, which are entered into thine house: for they be come to search out all the country. And the woman took the two men, and hid them, and said thus, There came men unto me, but I wist not whence they were: And it came to pass about the time of shutting of the gate, when it was dark, that the men went out: whither the men went I wot not: pursue after them quickly; for ye shall overtake them. But she had brought them up to the roof of the house, and hid them with the stalks of flax, which she had laid in order upon the roof."

Joshua 2:1-6, KJV

"And the city shall be accursed, even it, and all that are therein, to the LORD: only Rahab the harlot shall live, she and all that are with her in the house, because she hid the messengers that we sent...And the young men that were spies went in, and brought out Rahab, and her father, and her mother, and her brethren, and all that she had; and they brought out all her kindred, and left them without the camp of Israel...And Joshua saved Rahab the harlot alive, and her father's household, and all that she had; and she dwelleth in Israel even unto this day; because she hid the messengers, which Joshua sent to spy out Jericho."
Joshua 6:17, 23, 25, KJV

"By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace."
Hebrews 11:31, KJV

"Likewise also was not Rahab the harlot justified by works, when she had received the messengers, and had sent them out another way? For as the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without works is dead also."
James 2:25-26, KJV

Returning to the Cairo Agreement of 1994, please notice that the following excerpts from said document reiterate the fact that Israel was required to withdraw its IDF military forces from both the Gaza Strip and from the West Bank. Furthermore, it was from the date on which this document was signed -- in other words, on May 4, 1994 -- that the agreed upon five-year interim period was to begin. In short, my friends, five years later, by May 4, 1999, the entire peace process was supposed to have been completed. By that time, the final status of Jerusalem was supposed to be determined, and the Palestinian people were supposed to have their own autonomous homeland. That is to say, a Palestinian State. Here it is in black and white:

----- Begin Quotes -----

Article II: Scheduled Withdrawal of Israeli Military Forces

1. Israel shall implement an accelerated and scheduled withdrawal of Israeli military forces from the Gaza Strip and from the Jericho Area to begin immediately with the signing of this Agreement. Israel shall complete such withdrawal within three weeks from this date'.

2. Subject to the arrangements included in the Protocol in the concerning Withdrawal of Israeli Military Forces and Security Arrangements attached as Annex 1, the Israeli withdrawal shall include evacuating all military bases and other fixed installations to be handed over to the Palestinian police, to be established pursuant to Article IX below (hereinafter "the Palestinian Police").

3. In order to carry out Israel's responsibility for external security and for internal security and public order of settlements and Israelis, Israel shall concurrently with the withdrawal, redeploy its remaining military forces to the Israeli settlements and Military Installation Area, in accordance with the provisions of this agreement. Subject to the provisions of this Agreements, this redeployment shall constitute full implementation of Article XIII of the Declaration of Principles with regard to the Gaza Strip and Jericho Area only.

4. For the purpose of this Agreement, "Israeli military forces" may include Israeli police and other Israeli security forces.

5. Israelis, including Israeli military forces, may continue to use roads freely within the Gaza Strip and the Jericho Area. Palestinians may use public roads crossing the settlements freely, as provided for in Annex I.

6. The Palestinian police shall be deployed and shall assume responsibility for public order and internal security of Palestinians in accordance with this Agreement and Annex I.

...

4. Upon the completion of the Israeli withdrawal and the transfer of powers and responsibilities as detailed in Annex II, the Civil Administration in the Gaza Strip and the Jericho Area will be dissolved and the Israeli military government will be withdrawn. The withdrawal of the military government shall not prevent it from continuing to exercise the powers and responsibilities specified in this Agreement.

...

Article XXIII: Final Clauses

1. This Agreement shall enter into force on the date of its

signing.

2. The arrangements establishing by this Agreement shall remain in force until and to the superseded by the Interim Agreement referred to in the Declaration Principles or any other agreement between the Parties.

3. The five-year interim period referred to in the Declaration of Principles commences on the date of the signing of this Agreement.

...

----- End Of Quote -----

One point I would like to emphasize here, is that this talk of a five-year interim period, by the end of which time the Palestinian State was supposed to come into existence, had been discussed since 1978 when the Camp David Accords were first signed. So as I pointed out earlier, the Palestinian people have now been relying upon diplomatic means for just under fifty years, just waiting for their dreams to become a reality. It is for this very reason that after waiting for fifteen years -- since 1978 -- the Palestinian people, under the leadership of Yasser Arafat, made sure that clause number three under the Final Clauses section of Article XXIII of the Cairo Agreement, clearly stated "The five-year interim period referred to in the Declaration of Principles commences on the date of the signing of this Agreement".

This was the Palestinian people's legally binding guarantee, which Israel said it would uphold. Through this particular clause, there was thus a very clear record and understanding, that by May 4, 1999, Palestinian President, Yasser Arafat, would indeed have a legal right to unilaterally declare the establishment of a Palestinian State, if it had not yet been accomplished. Following are various excerpts taken from a CNN news report dated January 11, 1999, in which Yasser Arafat makes various comments regarding the May 4, 1999 deadline:

----- Begin Quote -----

"We cannot bypass that date simply because one of the parties (Israel) wants to keep it hostage to its narrow domestic calculations, by procrastinating and freezing negotiations and agreements ...," Arafat told a group of world leaders and Palestinian lawmakers gathered in the West

Bank town of Ramallah.

"We are not going to reverse our position on peace despite everything the present Israeli government is doing. ... We will not go back to confrontation, and we will not allow anybody to stop the historic reconciliation between our peoples," he added.

"We have the full right to say that May 4 is a date to be respected. But at the same time, if the world comes to us with 'What are you going to do on May 4?' we say the question should be addressed by all those who signed the agreement," Erakat said.

Some observers say the Palestinian leadership is looking for a face-saving formula, perhaps one backed by the United States, that would allow a delay in the declaration of statehood.

Continuing our discussion from part one, it was in fact a direct result of Israel continually dragging its feet with regard to the agreed upon troop withdrawal, that this very same issue became a major point that was likewise included in the Wye Memorandum of late 1998. Not only did the Israeli Knesset stall for several weeks before finally ratifying the Wye Accord, even though both Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Palestinian President, Yasser Arafat, jointly signed it in Washington, DC, but even after they did ratify it, only a short time after that, the Israelis reneged on it again, and brought the withdrawal of Israeli military forces from the Occupied Lands to a complete halt.

While various reasons were cited by the Israelis for taking this decisive action, their primary argument was based upon terms such as the following, which were incorporated into the 1993 Declaration Of Principles, and in the 1994 Cairo Agreement as well:

----- Begin Quote -----

From the Declaration Of Principles:

3. Further redeployments to specified locations will be gradually implemented commensurate with the assumption of responsibility for public order and internal security by the Palestinian police force pursuant to Article VIII above.

From the Cairo Agreement:

Article XVIII: Prevention Of Acts

Both sides shall take all measures necessary in order to prevent acts of terrorism, crime and hostilities directed against each other, against individuals falling under the other's authority and against their property, and shall take legal measures against offenders. In addition, the Palestinian side shall take all measures necessary to prevent such hostile acts directed against the settlement, the infrastructure serving them and the military installation area, and the Israeli side shall take all measures necessary to prevent such hostile acts emanating from the settlements and directed against Palestinians.

----- End Quote -----

If one carefully considers these clauses, he realizes that they were a legal loophole which could easily be exploited by the shrewd and manipulative Israelis, to keep the peace process in jeopardy for many years to come. In fact, it is a matter of record that this is exactly what they have done for decades now. Of course, the Palestinians haven't helped themselves by engaging in intifadas, suicide bomb attacks, rocket launches from Gaza, and of course, and tragically, the terrible carnage they delivered on October 7, 2023. As a result of Hamas' deadly assault, as I mentioned earlier, the people of Gaza have paid a very high price with more than 70,000 Gazans killed since the Israel-Hamas war began. In addition, another 171,000 Gazans have been injured as reported by online sources. Likewise, 2,000,000 Gazans have been displaced from their homes.

As I briefly mentioned in part one, through their very sly ruse of intentional procrastination, which has indefinitely delayed any type of final status agreement, which in itself

would determine the fate of Jerusalem, as well as establish the Palestinian State, the Israelis have bought themselves more time to do exactly what they have wanted to do. What is that exactly? They have entrenched themselves even more deeply in East Jerusalem and the West Bank by continuing to expand current settlements, establishing new settlements, building new housing projects, building new roads and also establishing new military outposts.

As I noted earlier, and likewise mention in a few other BBB articles, the end result of all of this activity is that the Israelis have now cut up and divided the West Bank to such a degree, that it has become virtually impossible to actually establish a contiguous Palestinian State, even if the parties ever did choose to return to a serious level of negotiations, which is very doubtful. Despite the world community strongly condemning Israel for its actions in the West Bank and in the Gaza Strip, the Israelis continue to engage in their illegal activities. They are survivors, and all they'll do is simply hunker down until the winds of negative public opinion pass. That is their way, after all.

Furthermore, at this point in time, continuing to carve up the West Bank really does not matter much anymore. Why not? Because as I mentioned in part one, Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has already made it rather clear that he will never allow a Palestinian State to be established. If anything, the vicious October 7, 2023 Hamas attack probably did a lot to harden his resolve. As if that is not already enough, the conservative hawks in Netanyahu's government would never allow him to compromise or go soft on Hamas and the Palestinians. I'm sure that he undoubtedly realizes this already.

Furthermore, given the nature of the Jews themselves, it is rather difficult for an Israeli prime minister to even keep his government together due to the factional infighting and the power plays which continually occur. I imagine that it is as cutthroat as American politics, if not more so. Then there are also the various corruption charges which have been brought against Bibi Netanyahu since quite some time ago. While Bibi may not show it publicly, he could very well be fighting for his political life as far as we know.

Aside from everything I have already shared with you, based alone on the established history of these negotiations over the past five decades, I would dare say that even if there

was never another car bomb explosion in Jerusalem, or some attack against Jewish settlers in the West Bank, or maybe a rocket launch into Israel from the Gaza Strip, the shrewd Israelis would undoubtedly still twist the stipulations of any potential agreement, and apply them to any number of other situations, in order to prove that Israel's security is still at grave risk by fanatical Palestinians such as Hamas. In other words, they will ALWAYS find a seemingly legitimate reason for why they cannot possibly make peace with the Palestinians.

My gosh, those Israelis will even point to certain incidents such as young Palestinian teenagers throwing rocks at armed Israeli soldiers as their justification for not bending to world opinion, and thus allowing the Palestinians to create their own state. To reiterate this point, the Israelis will ALWAYS find excuses -- justifiable or not -- for why they'll never allow the establishment of a Palestinian State that exists side-by-side with the nation of Israel. Furthermore, as long as Benjamin Netanyahu remains in power, it's a sure thing. He is a direct impediment to any kind of peace deal.

Let's be honest here, my friends. Isn't it being quite naive to even suggest that the time will someday arrive when all feelings of hatred, racism and mistrust will be completely eradicated from the minds and the hearts of the Israelis and the Palestinians? This "family feud" has been going on for literally thousands of years. A few signed documents is not going to change what has been thought, felt and taught for such a long time. For those of my readers who are Americans, allow me to ask you a simple question. Has every negative feeling ever been truly erased between Whites and Blacks in the United States of America since its founding two hundred and fifty years ago?

Of course not! There still remain hostile feelings between certain members of these two races. Yes, I will agree that considerable progress has been made. White person would dare to live, unless he is suicidal and wants to see his life cut short for simply looking at some person the wrong way.

As I said, some progress has been made. A lot depends on in what part of the country a person lives. The people in some areas are more open-minded and receptive to people of the Black race, while in other areas -- such as the Deep South, for example -- a lot of prejudice still remains. Of course, it may not always be readily apparent, but it is boiling just below the surface, my friends. In fact, I was shocked to discover how alive this prejudice and fear still is over a dozen years ago when a particular friend of mine came to visit me here on Guam. My friend was in fact a native of the Deep South.

While Guam is a small island -- although the largest island in the Mariana Islands archipelago, and in fact the largest in all of Micronesia -- it is also home to a multicultural society. We have residents from some of the other islands, such as Saipan, Tinian, Koror, Kosrae, Chuuk, Pohnpei and Yap. There is also a large population from the Philippines, some Statesiders such as myself, Japanese, Koreans and some Australians as well. This is, of course, in addition to the locals who are known as the Chamorros.

At any rate, I decided to take my friend on a car tour of our small island, stopping at a number of naturally pretty spots along our route so that we could snap a few photos. Well, we arrived at this one place that is located at the southern end of our island called Inarajan Pools. As their name implies, these are a series of natural and peaceful limestone pools carved out by the ocean right on the coast, separated from the crashing waves by the reef. The pools are a popular swimming hole, and also a tourist attraction.

So, upon arriving there, I began to get out of the car when I noticed that for some reason my friend hesitated. In fact, it wasn't just simple hesitation, my friends. I could see my friend's discomfort and the fear in their eyes. So what in the world could possibly cause my friend to react in such a negative fashion? When I tell you, you may be as shocked as I was in that moment. You see, there were already a few cars parked there, and there were some local residents gathered around a few of the picnic tables. They were obviously not as light-skinned as my visiting friend, and this apparently sent my friend into this fearful state.

While I eventually coaxed my friend out of the car, we only stayed long enough to snap a few quick photos -- due to my friend's fear -- and then we were off again. Of course, when I got out of the car and saw the other visitors to the site, I naturally greeted them. After all, they were no threat to us whatsoever. They were simply enjoying the beauty of the place, and they were island residents just like me. I was well used to our blended multicultural society here. Not so with my friend.

You should know that I have never publicly shared this story with anyone before. However, given that we have been talking about the hatred and animosity which still exists between the Israelis and the Palestinians, I think that this sad account from my personal life is quite appropriate. It is indeed very sad though that in the 21st century, a person can still react in such a negative fashion, just because someone else looks different from them.

Returning to the situation in Israel, because these negative feelings will continue to exist, there are always going to be clashes at some level between the Israeli and Palestinian societies. Some will be more violent than others. My saying this is by no means meant to condone such acts of violence. However, it is to point out that as long as even one single incident occurs, Israel will always claim to have a valid reason for NOT fulfilling any of its legal obligations as had been agreed upon, NOT withdrawing its troops from the Occupied Territories, and most certainly NOT allowing an independent Palestinian State to exist along side of it.

My friends, I don't care how many years pass, or how many discussions are held, or how many agreements are signed. I am convinced that the crafty Jews will always renege, and will always find some supposedly legitimate excuse for not doing what the world expects of them. That is to say, allow the Palestinians to have their own state. In my opinion, to even believe that such a thing is still possible at this stage, is to purposely deceive oneself. You may or may not agree with me, but I am being a realist. Can you say the same thing?

Sadly, this Israeli procrastination ruse is strengthened in the United States by the simple and obvious fact -- at least it is obvious to those people who have their eyes wide open -- that the shrewd Jews control just about every sector of

For those of my readers who do have their eyes open, if you take the time to read my 2012 six-part series called "Welcome to Greater Israel, USA!", you'll in fact see -- particularly in parts five and six -- that I did my homework when I wrote that series. I dug deep to find true, accurate information. I name companies and specific individuals who come from Jewish backgrounds, and who control every facet of American society. Given the age of the series, some of those individuals are of course no longer alive, while others no longer hold positions of power. But it does NOT change the overall story of Jewish control in America. Believe as you will.

As I point out in my article entitled "Gaslighting: We Are Being Manipulated and Surveilled", while many Americans may deny this fact, the simple truth of the matter is that they are psychologically manipulated every single day of their lives. Every time they turn on the radio, or the television set, or read a newspaper or magazine, or watch a movie, or go online, they are being subtly indoctrinated to a degree by these very same Zionist controllers. In fact, the people of whom I speak have heavily infiltrated the government of the United States itself, and they surround and manipulate every single American president.

Are these crafty manipulators always outright Jews? No they are not. They are smarter than that. That is why they also have their stooges, puppets and proxies who do their work for them, sometimes without even realizing that they are in fact doing the work of their Jewish masters. A good case in point are the pro-Israel, Zionist Christians who currently have a huge influence on American foreign policy. While such a thought is indeed ludicrous, nonetheless, it is the erroneous stereotypical image that has actually been created in the minds and hearts of some Americans by the manipulative Zionist controllers.

Along the very same lines, as I mentioned a moment ago, the manipulative Jews have done a great job at brainwashing the American public with regard to the controversial subject of antisemitism. There are now many people in America who are simply afraid of speaking a single negative word against the state of Israel and against the Jews. And boy have they heaped praise on him, even going so far as to refer to him as the "Prince of Peace".

For those of you who may not be aware of it, back in 2018, after President Trump made the rather controversial decision to recognize Jerusalem as the capital of Israel, and in fact moved the American embassy to that city, the Temple Institute -- which also goes by the name of Mikdash Educational Center -- minted a commemorative gold coin in Trump's honor. Referred to as the "Temple Coin", it bears Trump's own image, and was minted as an expression of the Jews' gratitude for what Trump had so boldly done. While the minting of this coin was a private initiative, and not an official state-issued coin, nevertheless, it reveals how close of a relationship President Trump has with the Jews.

In fact, as I also mentioned a moment ago, there are many brainwashed American Christians who go out of their way to actually praise the antichrist Jews, and who will support Israel no matter what they do. Sadly, this even includes giving their obedient nod to what Israel has been doing in Gaza and the West Bank. As many of my readers will already know, just say one critical word against the Jews, and see how fast you find yourself branded as an antisemite by the mesmerized Israel-drunk masses. And yet, oddly enough, we are constantly reminded that freedom of speech still exists in America.

Regarding accusations of antisemitism, a good case in point concerns well-known American conservative media icon, Tucker Carlson, and the American conservative political commentator and author, Candace Owens. As some of my readers will already know, both of these individuals have a very large following in the United States.

I don't believe that very much needs to be said concerning Tucker Carlson. After working for news entities such as The New York Times Magazine, The Daily Beast, The Wall Street Journal, CNN, PBS and MSNBC, Tucker achieved his greatest fame through his association with Fox News as an outspoken political analyst from 2009 to 2023. As many of my American readers will know, Carlson hosted his own nightly political talk show -- Tucker Carlson Tonight -- on Fox News from 2016 to 2023. In 2010, Carlson also co-founded and served as the initial editor-in-chief of the right-wing news and opinion website The Daily Caller, which he eventually left in 2020. Since leaving Fox News, Tucker has hosted "Tucker" on the X platform, as well as his very popular podcast, "The Tucker Carlson Show".

For her part, while formerly a liberal, Candace Owens chose to switch to the conservative side of the fence, and thus became a Republican and an avid Donald Trump supporter. She served as the communications director for Turning Point USA -- Charlie Kirk's organization -- from 2017 to 2019. Also, in 2018, she helped to co-found the BLEXIT Foundation, which was dedicated to promoting conservative principles such as economic independence, individual freedom, and self-reliance amongst Black people and other minority populations. BLEXIT merged with Turning Point USA in 2023.

After working for the Prager University Foundation -- a.k.a. PragerU, a nonprofit advocacy group and media organization that creates content promoting conservative and capitalist viewpoints -- in 2021 Owens joined The Daily Wire and began hosting "Candace", which was a political talk show.

So exactly what really happened to Carlson and Owens, and why is there now so much controversy swirling around both of them? I will be honest and tell you that even trying to discover the truth in this modern world can be a difficult endeavor and challenge. It all depends on who you talk to or read, and which side you choose to believe. In short, it really comes down to a "he said, she said" debate. What I can tell you is that according to online sources, Owens

was supposedly dismissed from The Daily Wire in March of 2024, due to a series of comments which were regarded as being antisemitic, and also after months of tensions with the co-founder and co-host of The Daily Wire -- that is to say, Ben Shapiro -- who just happens to be an observant, Orthodox Jew.

I was also curious as to why Owens would suddenly leave Turning Point USA after not only merging her organization with it, but then serving as its communications director from 2017 to 2019. That seems like a serious investment of both time and energy to me. Well, according to what I found online, she resigned from Turning Point USA in 2019 after a certain controversy arose regarding comments she had made concerning Adolf Hitler, regarding her defense of Kanye West after certain antisemitic comments he had made on social media, and lastly, because she likewise supported the view that Charlie Kirk's assassination was linked to the state of Israel. Well, if any of that is true -- you can check for yourself -- that is certainly one quick way to get oneself into serious trouble with the Jews.

Similar to Owens, Carlson has faced significant backlash for some of his statements and associations, such as with Nick Fuentes, who has been branded as a Holocaust denier and Nazi supporter. According to what I've read, prominent Jewish groups, evangelical leaders, and certain Republican figures increasingly view Tucker Carlson as an antisemite, comparing his rhetoric and actions to those of Mrs. Owens. For example, just last month -- November 2025 -- Florida's US Representative, Randy Fine, remarked at the Republican Jewish Coalition Leadership Summit, that Tucker Carlson is the "most dangerous antisemite in America". And, of course, just like Ben Shapiro, Randy Fine is also Jewish and wore his yarmulke -- Jewish skullcap worn by Orthodox Jews -- at the summit.

One thing I can tell you about the Jews is that while they may often be at each other's throats, when they are under attack, they will band together like a pack of wild wolves and attack whoever is exposing them. As any quick Internet search will reveal, they have long lines of communication, and when someone says anything negative against them, the information will travel faster than lightning, and you'll soon discover Jewish website after Jewish website -- such as news and commentary websites -- coming rather strongly against, criticizing and condemning the person who made

the original comment.

However, as the two aforementioned examples clearly reveal, the Jews do NOT stop there. They seek ultimate damage. Thus, they will try to strike you where it will really hurt you. And where is that? Obviously, in your pocket book. If they can cause you financial hardship -- such as by causing you to lose your job -- they WILL do it. So beware! They won't hesitate to knock you down, tear you down, steal your mode of living from you, discredit your name and occupation, and do whatever else they can to force you into silence so that you will never speak against them again. Furthermore, the more you try to expose them, the harder they'll strike you down. So, my friends, count the cost before you decide to expose the ugly underbelly of our Jewish-controlled world.

Continuing our discussion from part two, while it may seem like we have deviated somewhat from our primary discussion, we really have not. That is because everything I have been sharing with you in these paragraphs concerns psychological manipulation, control, shaping public opinion, and altering

your personal worldview so that it conforms to the way that the controllers want you to see and understand things. In short, it is an ongoing, massive gaslighting operation to control your reality.

This ongoing operation, of course, includes how you are made to view Arabs, Muslims, Palestinians and Gazans. Yes, there is in fact a big difference in who each of these four words should be applied to. For example, not all Palestinians are Gazans, if they don't even live in Gaza. In similar fashion, not all Arabs are Muslims. While approximately 93% of Arabs are in fact Muslims, there are likewise Arabs who embrace Christianity, the Druze religion, the Bahá'í faith, and even Judaism.

Furthermore, not all Muslims are Arabs either. For example, there are large Muslim populations in Indonesia, Pakistan, India and Bangladesh. In fact, it may surprise you to know that less than 15% of Muslims are Arabs. So did I just alter your worldview by telling you something you didn't know? You see, my friends, percentages are extremely important because they can alter how we choose to view different things. This, of course, includes how we view certain people. This point dovetails right into our current discussion regarding the Israelis, the Palestinians, the Gazans and the Israel-Hamas War.

As I told you in part two, if we are so foolish as to simply and blindly trust in the American mainstream media, we might arrive at the erroneous conclusion that all Palestinians are surely violent terrorists. "Oh, yes! They are just wild-eyed, crazy fanatics who will quote an ayah -- or verse -- from the Qur'an, as they shout "Allahu Akbar!", strap a bomb to their back, or tape grenades to their body, and then run straight into a crowd of innocent bystanders. They are very dangerous people!"

Have you heard people talk like that, or perhaps seen some of them make posts or type comments on the social networks which carry a warped attitude like that? I mentioned percentages to you a minute ago. Well, the fact of the matter is that aside from the October 7, 2023 incident, actual terrorist attacks in Israel are carried out by a small minority of Palestinians. I am talking about the very radical individuals who have been brainwashed by Hamas' violent ideology which wants to see the Jews of Israel cast into the sea.

As I mentioned to you in part two, some of the incidents which are reported by IDF forces are NOT really terrorist attacks in the truest sense of the word. In actuality, they are misguided teenagers -- probably influenced by Hamas -- who are throwing rocks at Israeli defense forces. This is a point which I also make in my article entitled "Guam Versus the Gaza Strip". No matter how you look at it, a misguided kid throwing rocks at IDF forces does not deserve to be shot dead. Yet, sadly, this has indeed happened in some cases. Furthermore, Israel has in fact publicly admitted that sometimes, such mistakes are made.

It may interest some of you to know that while writing "Guam Versus the Gaza Strip", I discovered that almost half of the population of the Gaza Strip is under the age of eighteen. In my mind, that immediately caused me to think of all of those impressionable, young people who are undoubtedly easy targets for radicalization by the leaders of Hamas. They are fertile ground for Hamas' violent ideology. My friends, that is NOT a very comforting picture. Furthermore, I am certain that the Israel-Hamas War is not helping the situation. In fact, the war has probably done a lot to convince a lot of those kids that what their leaders and other elders have taught them regarding the Jews is true.

Think about it, my friends. Many of those young people's homes have been destroyed. They have lost family members. They live in poverty and squalor, and probably in fear for their very lives. Now, as the Israel-Hamas War continues, they are being forced by IDF forces to move again and again. How would you feel if you found yourself in such a dire situation? Not very happy I would imagine. Probably rather angry in fact. To make matters worse, as I write this series, the coldest months of the year -- that being December through March -- are now upon the people of Gaza when the average temperature can drop to around 46°. However, due to rain and wind, sometimes it can feel even colder than that.

While at first glance this may not seem too bad, you need to remember that many of the Gazans are now required to live in tents as they are forced to move from place to place so that the Israelis can bomb and take control of another sector of Gaza. Of course, you probably will not hear too much of this -- if anything at all -- on the nightly, Jewish-controlled news. After all, those networks execs need to maintain their pro-Israel narrative if they really want to keep their jobs. Remember again how Tucker Carlson was ousted from his job when he began to speak out against the Jews.

All I can say is that it is very disheartening to know that those young kids in Gaza are being raised in an environment where they will learn to hate the Jews at a very early age, due to their current tragic circumstances where violence, death, hunger, poverty, squalor and fear are their constant companions. Because of it, they will probably never be given an opportunity to learn that violence only breeds even more violence. As Jesus taught in the Gospels:

"And, behold, one of them which were with Jesus stretched out his hand, and drew his sword, and struck a servant of the high priest's, and smote off his ear. Then said Jesus unto him, Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword."

Matthew 26:51-52, KJV

Now, obviously, I do not reside in the West Bank, or in the Gaza Strip. As such, I really do not know what the average Palestinian is actually like. Perhaps it is just my personal idealism, but I would think that the Palestinian people as a whole are very similar to you and me. In other words, they weep. They are happy. They suffer broken hearts. They suffer hunger. They long for a better future for their kids. They worry about whether or not there will be enough money to pay their bills. Just all of the normal everyday stuff.

But they also have other burdens which you and I don't have. For example, they have to hope that tomorrow the Jews won't lock down their borders, and thus prevent them from working at their jobs in Israel. They fear that perhaps tomorrow the Jews might claim their land as a part of their expansionist policy and bulldoze their house, thus leaving them homeless. They worry that their children might be shot and killed by a nervous Israeli soldier and never come home. Do you get the picture? They may embrace another religion which we do not agree with, but aside from that, we are all very much alike.

You know, if I were so foolish as to judge a nation, or a people, by the actions of a few, as the Jewish-controlled mainstream media has caused many Americans to do regarding the Palestinians, then I could quite probably come to the erroneous conclusion that every American must no doubt be a serial killer, or else gay or lesbian, or maybe a drug user, or perhaps an abortionist, or maybe an unbridled sex fiend, or a politically corrupt liar and perjurer, or maybe even a murderer who eats his victims, or a God-hating atheist, or a

gangster, or perhaps even a crazy terrorist who sends out mail bombs, or who blows up buildings.

Due to my misguided understanding, I could look at different things happening within the United States, being committed by isolated individuals, or perhaps even by the government, and convince myself that the United States of America is just one dangerous nation full of a lot of sick and mentally unbalanced people. Tell me though. Would my assessment be accurate? I am sure you see the point I am making here. Well, that is what the Jews do. They purposely control the narrative through the mainstream media so that you only see the situation in Israel the way that the Jews want you to see it.

As I explained to you earlier, that is how the Jews justify all of their actions against the Palestinians. That is how they justify killing 70,000 Gazans when Hamas kills around 1,200 Israelis. As I have mentioned before, the Jews have a propensity for always killing a disproportionate number of people when they retaliate against Palestinian violence. It is an established fact. There are so many clear examples of this. Just conduct your own research, and you will discover that this is true. As I said, the Jews are a very vengeful, vicious, hateful lot of people, despite how they try to present themselves to the world, or on the nightly news.

My friends, it is a very ugly and uncomfortable thing to even have to compare war casualties. I certainly don't like to do it. However, it needs to be done so that you can see exactly how lopsided Israel's responses have been against the people of Gaza, and Palestinians in general. Everything they've been doing is contrary to the four principles of the Law of War. In particular, the principle of unnecessary suffering. If you are not familiar with the four principles, please google it.

At this point in our talk, let me take a minute to clarify and reiterate something which I briefly mentioned to you in part two. Just because I have demonstrated a certain degree of sympathy and understanding for the Palestinian people, does NOT mean that I support them in every way. As should already be apparent to you, I most certainly do NOT support or condone Islamic violence. Neither do I support the Muslim faith. As a longtime Bible-believing Christian, I hold some very strong objections to the Islamic faith, as I point out in articles such as the series "Holy Qur'an and Islam: A Doctrine of Devils?", which you will find listed at the end of this same series.

Furthermore, as some of my readers will already know, I am a man of peace, who has in fact lived a life of peace for my entire life. As such, I do NOT support any level of violence originating from any faith, not even from my own faith. It's NOT what Jesus and the Apostles taught us. I discuss this subject in more detail in articles such as "Killing and the Phinehas Priesthood", "Why I Hate War: An Exposé on Human Violence", and "Killing, Murder, War and Military Duty".

As a Christian, it is my primary responsibility to view all people, regardless of their particular ethnic origin, from the perspective of whether or not they receive the message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ when they hear it. In this regard, it's plainly evident that the vast majority of both Israelis and Palestinians do greatly err. As I point out in other BBB articles, while both parties claim to believe in the one true God of Heaven, both deny the Divine Sonship, as well as the Messiahship, of Jesus Christ. While the physical well-being of the Palestinian people is indeed important, it is their spiritual well-being which is of greater importance to the Lord. As Jesus himself said in the Gospels:

"It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing: the words that I speak unto you, they are spirit, and they are life."

John 6:63, KJV

"For what shall it profit a man, if he shall gain the whole world, and lose his own soul? Or what shall a man give in exchange for his soul?"

Mark 8:36-37, KJV

"And fear not them which kill the body, but are not able to kill the soul: but rather fear him which is able to destroy both soul and body in hell."

Matthew 10:28, KJV

So as you can plainly see, our spiritual well-being and our future is what is most important. Everything else is really secondary. As far as our Father in Heaven is concerned, what is most important to Him is whether or not a person's sins have been blotted out by the Blood of His dear Son, Jesus.

Returning to the subjects with which I began this series -- that is to say, the Camp David Accords, the Declaration Of Principles and the Wye Memorandum -- what we've learned is

that due to the security clauses which were incorporated into these Agreements, there's always existed the potential for the government of Israel to stall the peace process for a very long time to come. This is precisely what they have done for five decades now. They purposely left a back door and a legal loophole, so that they could claim to never be fully satisfied with any endeavors which were made by the Palestinian authorities to control their population.

In short, the Israelis have been left with the ability to accuse the Palestinians of non-compliance with the agreed upon security measures, any time the slightest incident or teenager-induced provocation has occurred. As I explained to you earlier in this series, through this sly tactic, the Jews have claimed to have a valid reason for not fulfilling their own obligations under the various accords they signed with the Palestinian people. As we previously discussed, the deadline for full Palestinian autonomy was supposed to be on May 4, 1999. It never happened, and to this very day, almost fifty years since the Camp David Accords were signed by Anwar al-Sadat and Menachem Begin, it STILL has not happened.

To anyone who has read this series in full, the Israeli game plan of procrastination, endless diplomatic discussions, and other stalling tactics, should be plainly evident to you. The record speaks for itself. Now, as we approach the very end of 2025, the Israeli-Palestinian situation is even worse than it has ever been before, due to Hamas' deadly October 7, 2023 attack, which was followed by Israel's very violent retaliation through the Israel-Hamas War. This very violent conflict has for the most part obliterated the Gaza Strip, killed over 70,000 Gazans, injured 171,000 Gazans, and left some 2,000,000 Gazans displaced from their homes. If you are wondering exactly how much destruction has been wrought by Israel's IDF forces, below is an image of Gaza City. I had to shrink it down in size considerably to fit it on this web page. However, it will still give you an idea of the level of destruction which has occurred in that city.

To reiterate, as I mentioned to you earlier, it is an ugly, uncomfortable thing to ever have to compare war statistics. Yet if we do it, in this case, there is simply no comparison between what the Palestinian people have suffered, and what the Israelis have likewise been forced to endure through the loss of their loved ones which occurred on October 7, 2023.

To reiterate something I said earlier, violence only begets even more violence. Thus, the Israelis and the Palestinians are now caught in a very vicious unending cycle of violence.

While a very fragile ceasefire was agreed upon on October 9, 2025 -- technically known as the Gaza Peace Plan, and also endorsed by the UN Security Council on November 17, 2025 -- appears to be holding for now, and even though Hamas has now returned all but one of the hostages -- dead or alive -- if we take into consideration the history of the Jews and Hamas, I personally do not think that the ceasefire will last much longer. In fact, based on Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu's own words, I don't believe that he even wants it to last. Why not? Because his ultimate goal is to completely crush Hamas, and totally remove them from the face of the earth. He won't be fully satisfied until that occurs. So as I have mentioned in other BBB articles, my suspicion is that Netanyahu is just waiting for a seemingly legitimate reason to go in and finish the job that he started.

Furthermore, as I mentioned to you in both parts one and two of this series. Netanyahu has made it abundantly clear that he is totally opposed to the establishment of a Palestinian State. As a matter of public record, in November of 2023, he said "I am the only one who will prevent a Palestinian state in Gaza and [the West Bank] after the war." Then, on January 18, 2024, Netanyahu rejected calls from the United States to initiate steps toward the establishment of said Palestinian State. In other words, my friends, Netanyahu fully rejects a so-called, and long-time evasive, two-state solution. We can add to this the fact that on February 17, 2024, PM Netanyahu stated, "We shall not bow down to international dictates in regards to a future deal with the Palestinians."

Is the picture becoming clear to you yet? If not, allow me to continue. Two days later on February 19, 2024, Netanyahu said that he'd propose legislation to oppose a Palestinian State. The very next day on February 20, 2024, he said a Palestinian state would "endanger our existence". Lastly, on April 25 of 2024, Bezalel Smotrich -- Israel's Minister of Finance -- said that he would cut off the transfer of Palestinian tax revenue to the Palestinian Authority, if they were to continue seeking international statehood recognition.

Now, in case you have forgotten -- admittedly, I have thrown a lot of information at you -- in part one of this series, I informed you that it was in fact PM Benjamin Netanyahu who in

1998 signed the Wye Memorandum with Yasser Arafat during the Bill Clinton administration. My friends, what does that tell you? It should tell you that Netanyahu has been playing this game of deception and procrastination for twenty-seven long years. He is a master at it. He has played ever single person who has come up against him with their plans for a two-state solution, for a fool.

So tell me, my friends, do you honestly think that the man is suddenly going to have a change of heart and say "Sure! Let's give the Palestinians their state right next to us!"? Not in your life! It is NEVER going to happen. Yet despite this, the USA and the rest of the world -- namely the United Nations -- continue to deceive themselves, and place their faith in the false hope that eventually, someday, they will finally win, and the Palestinian people will finally have their own state along side Israel. Quite frankly, there is only ONE way that I can personally ever see that happening, and that is by direct military intervention in Israel, to force Israel to acquiesce to international demands for a Palestinian State.

Some of you may find it interesting to know that to date, at least eleven countries have either recalled their ambassadors from Israel, or severed ties altogether with Israel since the Israel-Hamas War began. These countries are the following:

Bahrain
Belize
Bolivia
Brazil
Chad
Chile
Colombia
Honduras
Jordan
South Africa
Turkey

However, the actions of those eleven countries was just the beginning of the international pressure campaign against the state of Israel. As of the time of this writing in December 2025, a total of 157 of the 193 member states of the United Nations General Assembly -- or just over 80% of them -- have thus far officially recognized Palestine as a sovereign state. But exactly what does this mean? It means that Palestine is not only the highest authority over its territory, but it is also an INDEPENDENT state.

However, you should know that there is a major catch to this, and some of my readers may not like to hear what it is. While four of the permanent members of the UN Security Council have recognized Palestine as a sovereign state -- that is to say, Russia, China, France and the United Kingdom -- guess which country has NOT recognized Palestine? Of course, I'm sure you already know the answer: the United States of America, a.k.a. Israel's lapdog and proxy. As a result, Palestine is still a non-member observer state of the United Nations. This status means that while it can participate in proceedings of the UN General Assembly, it CANNOT vote in the General Assembly or on the Security Council.

In short, my friends, similar to many of the UN resolutions which are passed by the General Assembly, for now at least, recognizing Palestine as a sovereign state is pretty much a toothless, non-binding gesture which bears zero legal weight. Don't get me wrong. It is a step in the right direction, and it will probably cause Israel to feel the full weight of the global community of nations pressing down on it due to its stubborn resistance to Palestinian statehood. However, I do not think that it will result in budging Benjamin Netanyahu from his current adamant position.

The way I look at the situation is the following. If Israel is not willing to agree to a two-state solution so that it can normalize relations with certain Arab nations -- Saudi Arabia has already tried that ruse and failed -- neither is it going to yield to UN pressure just so UN member states will stop condemning it for its disproportionate, genocidal actions in the Gaza Strip. As I said earlier, the nature of the Jews is to just hunker down until the winds of negative public opinion die down, which they eventually will do. I imagine that Benjamin Netanyahu is probably counting on it.

While Palestine obviously already has the needed support of two thirds of UN member states -- which is required in order to become a full member state itself -- ALL FIVE permanent members of the UN Security Council must agree to it as well. To reiterate, the United States does NOT agree. Furthermore, the United States has consistently used its veto power to block the Palestinians' path to full membership in the UN, and insisted that Palestinian statehood should be achieved through direct negotiations with the state of Israel.

Thus, even if all 193 members of the UN General Assembly

decided to officially recognize Palestine as a sovereign state, the combined legal weight of those 193 members would still be nullified or neutralized by that single veto from the United States. Furthermore, as we have already seen, as long as Benjamin Netanyahu remains in power, the two-state solution is totally dead in the water. So again, in my view, what is occurring at the UN with regard to Palestine is just non-binding smoke and mirrors which won't amount to anything of real substance without American support. Thus, Israel has won its fight for now, because it has the USA in its pocket.

With these thoughts, I will bring this article to a close. It is my hope that you've found it informative and enlightening, and I pray that it has been a blessing in your life as well.
